

Town Hall winter closures: Monday, January 2—New Year's Day observed; Monday, January 16—Martin Luther King, Jr. Day; and Monday, February 20—Presidents Day.

For your convenience, vehicle renewals and dog license renewals may be completed online. Instructions and costs for this service are found in your renewal letter and when clicking the red "Pay Online" button found on the home page of our Town website, www.strafford.nh.gov. It's easy and convenient. Only renewals can be processed online; 2017 dog renewals can be processed online beginning January 1, 2017; allow one week for processing; new vehicles, vehicle transfers, and new dogs must be processed in person at the Town Clerk's office. When licensing a new dog, you will be required to provide proof of rabies vaccination.




CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH EVENTS


SCHOOL BOARD NOTES FROM CHAIRMAN MONAHAN

As a new Board member, Carrolle was very helpful to me as I learned the processes and policies of the Board. Once I became the Chairman, she was an amazing asset and wealth of knowledge as the Board tackled budgets, hired new administrators, and negotiated contracts. Her willingness to dedicate her time to this very important position, for the many years she did, along with taking care of the election process as the District Clerk, shows her true character in being a part of this Town. She is, and will continue to be, sorely missed at our meetings. As the current Board Chairman, I cannot thank her enough for what she has done for our Town and School.

These meetings are very important since the School budget makes up a large portion of the Town tax rate. It is approximately ten times the amount of the Town budget. Please make the time to attend and participate in this process.

How to better restrict cheating on voting day was the first thing discussed. There are a lot of proposals, and it is a complex challenge. The New Hampshire House will receive committee assignments from Speaker Jasper. Legislation usually take some time to go through committees, votes in each House, and reconciliation between the House and Senate. There are some exceptions such as a response to the opioid crisis that was achieved in 3 weeks. The House may move their session days to be on Thursdays, which is the same day the Senate has their sessions so that House members miss fewer votes due to attendance at Senate hearings. We discussed how President-Elect Trump has so quickly and impressively picked his Cabinet. 

CONSERVATION NOTES

Good conservation news this month. On December 15 Bear-Paw board members and Phil and Carolyn Auger signed the documents to protect another 86 acres with a donated conservation easement. Back in 1998, the Auger's original donated easement of 96 acres along with Corey Colwell's 150 acres were the very first Bear-Paw easements in the region. Since then, more Strafford private landowners have protected their land with donated Bear-Paw easements, and strong citizen support and our conservation fund have helped protect several large public lands to bring our total of Bear-Paw easement properties to well over 2500 acres. When you add the conservation properties protected through other agencies, new maps show that Strafford is fortunate to have 27% of our Town's lands protected with much of it available for low impact recreational use by the public. The Conservation Commission thanks the Augers for adding to the wildlife habitat, water resource protection and scenic beauty of our Town.

More good news for Strafford citizens—the Bear-Paw Annual Meeting on Saturday, January 28, is coming back to Coe-Brown Northwood Academy this year. When Bear-Paw held it down in Hooksett, Strafford folks still made up a big percent of the gathering even on that snowy morning two years ago. This year with the focus on protecting Bennett Island, the hope is for strong ice on Bow Lake that will allow the afternoon hike to be across to the island. The speaker in the morning will be Sam Evans Brown from New Hampshire Public Radio's *Outside In* program. Bear-Paw is looking for donations of interesting raffle items and also for
