
#### **BOW LAKE FREE WILL BAPTIST CHURCH**



Online Vehicle Renewals & Dog Licensing—You can renew your vehicle registrations and license your dogs with the Strafford Town Clerk online. Just follow the instructions on the renewal letters we send OR go to www.strafford.nh.gov (our Town website) and locate the red "Online Payments" button on the home page. The Strafford Town Clerk will process your online renewals and mail your registrations/licenses to you. It's easy and convenient. Only renewals can be processed online; allow one week for processing; all new vehicles, vehicle transfers, and new dogs must continue to be processed in person at the Town Clerk's office. We continue to offer renewal services by mail or in person at the Town Clerk's office.

The Town Hall will be closed on the following days in October, November, and December 2016: Monday, October 10, 2016—Columbus Day; Tuesday, November 8, 2016—General Election—open for voting only; and Thursday, November 24, 2016—Thanksgiving Day.

The General Election will be held at Strafford Town Hall on Tuesday, November 8, 2016. The polls will be open for voting from 8:00 am to 7:00 pm.

Voter Registration for State General Election / Supervisors of the Checklist Session—You may register to vote with the Town Clerk during regular business hours on or before Thursday, October 27, 2016. You may also register to vote at the Supervisors of the Checklist session to be held on Saturday, October 29, 2016 from 11:00 to 11:30 am at Strafford Town Hall. If you have not registered to vote by October 29 and wish to vote at the State General Election, you may register at the polling place on Election


#### **READY RIDES**

#### **CONSERVATION NOTES**

A NO FIRES sign has gone up on the kiosk at the Spencer Smith Trail at the Town Forest, and that prohibition also applies to any of our Town conservation lands. Anyone with a lick of sense can understand that with our drought conditions a small campfire could lead to a real disaster in our Town Forest and possibly spread beyond the forests to homes. In the past, campfires carefully managed by the Cub and Boy Scouts have been permitted at the Town Forest. At this time, however, even the Scouts should not plan to have a campfire if they are having activities in the Town Forest. The other problem with campfire sites at the Town Forest is an increasing amount of trash that has

been building up. All of our conservation lands have a "Carry in, Carry out" policy, and throwing a can into a fire or breaking a glass container into the fire circle does NOT meet with that policy! The Conservation Commission is planning a clean-up day and will welcome any volunteers who would like to join us.

Over on the



School District Conservation Property is another clean-up opportunity that could provide community service credit for any students who don't already have that requirement accomplished. Just off Johnsonboro Road on the way into the Hill Pond is an old house foundation that in the past some have used as a place to dump trash. Conservation Commission members would be glad to help organize and lead a crew who could clean up the foundation and the area around it that also has old shotgun shells and other waste scattered about. The Bennett Island Forever flamingos only have about another month to fly before the ground freezes and they can no longer land; so if you have been thinking of flocking a friend, order your flock online at the Bear-Paw website now. As of Calendar deadline in mid-September, there have been more than 80 flamingo flights in Strafford and Northwood. Bear-Paw has submitted grant requests to several agencies; and as soon as we know that any have been awarded, we will report it here. Generous donors have also written checks for significant amounts toward the permanent conservation of Bennett Island. And stop by the Bow Lake Grange Hall on October 1 from 3 to 7 pm to hear Island Mike and Friends playing their benefit concert for Bennett Island. Admission is free with donations encouraged. The Northwood Crank Pullers will have their food trailer outside the Grange Hall where you can buy your snack or dinner with all proceeds going to the Bennett Island Forever

#### **CATAMOUNT WOMENAID ANNUAL 5K**

Enjoy the scenic autumn beauty of New England's Oldest Family Fairgrounds at the second annual Catamount 5K at the Deerfield Fairgrounds on Sunday, November 6, 2016 at 9 am. The course is a cross country-type run on dirt, gravel, grass, and a little pavement. About 90% of the route is in open view of spectators, and there's only a slight incline along with a decent downhill. The route is challenging enough for seasoned racers, but also appropriate for families and groups of walkers. This 5K is offered by Catamount Womenaid and designed to bring the community together and promote health and wellness while supporting the small Deerfield-based non-profit. Online registration is available until 11/5/16 for \$22, and the first 100 registrants will receive free fleece hats. 


#### STRAFFORD WOMEN'S CLUB
