

# SUPERVISORS OF THE CHECKLIST

Supervisors of the Strafford Checklist will be sitting at Town Hall on Tuesday, September 6, 2016, from 7 to 7:30 pm for additions and corrections of Checklist per RSA 654:27, 28. No additions or corrections shall be made to the Checklist after this session until Election Day, except as provided in RSA 659:12, RSA 654:8 II. No change of party until after the Primary Election on September 13, 2016, according to RSA 654.34. If you are registering as a new voter, a photo ID, proof of citizenship, age, and residency in Strafford needs to be provided.

# NOTES FROM THE TOWN CLERK

Regular Business Hours: Mon/Wed/Thu–8:30 to 2:00; Tuesday-1:00 to 7:00.

Online Vehicle Renewals & Dog Licensing—You can renew your vehicle registrations and license your dogs with the Strafford Town Clerk online. Just follow the instructions on the renewal letters we send OR go to www.strafford.nh.gov (our Town website) and locate the red "Online Payments" button on the home page. The Strafford Town Clerk will process your online renewals and mail your registrations/licenses to you. It's easy and convenient. Only renewals can be processed online; allow one week for processing; all new vehicles, vehicle transfers, and new dogs must continue to be processed in person at the Town Clerk's office. We continue to offer renewal services by mail or in person at the Town Clerk's office.

The Town Hall (including the Town Clerk's Office) will be closed on the following days in September, October, and November 2016: Monday, September 5, 2016—Labor Day; Tuesday, September 13, 2016—State Primary Election—open for voting only; Monday, October 10, 2016—Columbus Day; Tuesday, November 8, 2016—General Election—open for voting only; and Thursday, November 24, 2016—Thanksgiving Day.

The State Primary Election will be held at Strafford Town Hall on Tuesday, September 13, 2016. The polls will be open for voting from 8:00 am to 7:00 pm.

voting from 8:00 am to 7:00 pm.

Voter Registration for State Primary Election / Supervisors of the Checklist Sessions—You may register to vote with the Town Clerk during regular business hours on or before Thursday, September 1, 2016. You may also register to vote at the Supervisors of the Checklist session to be held on Tuesday, September 6, 2016 from 7:00 to 7:30 pm at Strafford Town Hall. If you have not registered to vote by September 6 and wish to vote at the State Primary Election, you may register at the polling place on Election Day, September 13. Please be sure to bring your picture ID with you when you register to vote and on Election Day.

# SCHOOL BOARD NEWS


The School Board would like to welcome all students and staff back to Strafford School and wish you all a very successful year. There have been some changes to the building over the summer which should help with maintenance and heating in the future. Also, with the successful vote on a new one-year collective bargaining agreement this summer, and the hiring of three new educators, the School is fully staffed with a contract in place. Because the contract is only for the 2016-2017 school year, the Board and Strafford Education Association will again begin negotiations this fall on a successor contract. As has been done in the past, the negotiators for the School Board will be holding a public discussion forum to answer any questions and talk about how you, the taxpayer, would like them to proceed. The current contract, as well as pay and benefits, will be presented to allow voters to be better informed. This is not a formal Board meeting, just a town hall-type discussion about a way forward. It would benefit the Board to have anyone with comments, concerns, or questions attend and bring them up during the meeting. The Board is elected by, and represents, all voters in Town. The collective bargaining agreement makes up a large portion of the School budget and is combined with the Town budget to set the tax rate. It has a direct impact on your taxes. Please make an effort to attend the meeting on Wednesday, September 21, 2016, from 5:30 to 7:30 pm at the School. If you can only stop by for a portion, we will try to address your concerns before you have to leave. If you can't get there until later, we will catch you up. This is a great

opportunity to let the Board know how you would like to proceed and get informed so that when a contract comes up for a vote you understand the ramifications of the decision.

# **CONSERVATION NOTES**

The Bennett Island Forever project got in to full swing in August with those flocks of flamingos making their appearance on lawns in Strafford and Northwood. Carolyn Page has organized teams of "flockers" and keeps us all on schedule with Mimi Jost's help. The money coming in goes toward the \$200,000 Bear-Paw needs to raise for the bargain sale of a conservation easement on the ten-acre Bennett Island. A "bargain sale" means that the owner, Bruce Montville, is willing to extinguish forever any development rights on the island for far less than what he could have gotten if he sold it for development. And we who enjoy Bow Lake, will know that the island will remain forever as the wildlife habitat it is today. If you want to enjoy the flamingo flocking fun but have lost the order form that appeared in last month's Calendar, just go to the Bear-Paw website, www.bear-paw.org to place your order.

Flamingos aren't the only fundraising path. Both the Strafford and Northwood Conservation Commissions have had trips to the Island and are planning to make significant contributions from their conservation funds. Bear-Paw has grant applications in the works, and our resident eagle and loon populations are the "celebrities" that make those applications look very promising. Individuals have already stepped up with greater gifts than a flamingo flock, and others have agreed to host house parties to encourage that kind of giving. Anyone who wishes to contribute to the cause may do so at the Bear-Paw website above.



Late breaking news at press time! Musician Mike Hall, whom many know as "Island Mike" from his appearances at the Nippo Lake restaurant, has offered to bring his musician friends together for a Musical Bennett Island Benefit at the Bow Lake Grange Hall on Saturday afternoon, October 1, 2016. Greg Bane and the Northwood Crank Pullers Snowmobile Club are also helping and will have their mobile food truck kitchen at the event with food and drink available for sale with proceeds going to the Bennett Island Forever project. There will be no charge to come on in to the Grange Hall and listen to the music, maybe sing along, but a Bennett Island collection bucket will invite whatever contribution you can make. Watch for more information about this event online.

Meanwhile, back at the Conservation Commission, work continues with plotting out a trail that connects the Spencer Smith Trail through the Town and Blue Hills Trust Evans Mountain properties. It has been difficult to find a path that meets the need of avoiding sensitive habitats that we want to protect, but with the help of Charlie Moreno and Phil Auger along with Conservation Commission members, we hope to have an approved route by the end of the summer with the actual trail work done later in the fall.

At the July Strafford Town Republican Committee Rep. Kurt Wuelper shared the story of a bill he sponsored to allow Bone Works Practitioners to operate in New Hampshire. Although their practice fell under some exclusions allowed so as to not need licensing by the State of New Hampshire, there was an effort by the Massage Therapy Board to mandate they attain Massage Therapy licenses to be able to practice. Kurt's bill allowing Bone Works Practitioners to not need a license passed both the New Hampshire House and Senate unanimously followed by a signature of the Governor.

A funny bit related was how some states are trying to crack down on lemonade stands. We also heard some of the story of Kurt's participation in the Portsmouth Naval Shipyard being in the State of New Hampshire. Despite the wealth of historical documentation of the boundary being on the north shore of the river versus the midpoint, hi jinx ruled the day. We talked of how Thomas Jefferson was concerned with the possibility of court hi jinx and, of course, spent some time talking about the exciting election approaching. 
