

### NOTES FROM THE TOWN CLERK

Regular Business Hours: Mon/Wed/Thu–8:30 to 2:00; Tuesday-1:00 to 7:00.

Mother Nature threw us a curve ball on Election Day last month, but 372 of you still made it to the polls during the blizzard. The decision to hold the election was not made lightly, and our Town Moderator, who has the final word, was careful to follow NH Law and the advice of the Secretary of State. Many of you took advantage of absentee voting (always an option for ballot elections); and the final number of voters was 409, just slightly below our 12-year average of 432. Thank you for your participation.

Please license all dogs by April 30. A reminder that all dogs 4 months and older must be licensed each year between January 1 and April 30. Avoid late fees. See below for details on licensing your dog online.

The Town Hall (Including the Town Clerk's Office) will be closed on the following days in May, June and July—Monday, May 29, 2017, Memorial Day; and Tuesday, July 4, 2017, Independence Day.

Online Vehicle Renewals & Dog Licensing—You can renew your vehicle registrations and license your dogs with the Strafford Town Clerk online. Just follow the instructions on the renewal letters we send or go to www.strafford.nh.gov (our Town website) and locate the red "Online Payments" button. The Strafford Town Clerk will process your online renewals and mail your registrations/licenses to you. It's easy and convenient. Only renewals can be processed online; allow one week for

processing; all new vehicles, vehicle transfers, and new dogs must be processed in person at the Town Clerk's office.

### **OHRV. FISHING & HUNTING LICENSES**

Snowmobiling may be over but NOT the fun times out of doors. If you have not yet registered those OHRVs, dirt bikes, three and four wheelers, *get 'er done*. If they were not registered in the past two years, you will need to know all the information about it (including the Vin #, color, CCs etc.). Maybe you have an older registration you could bring with you with all the information.

Fishing, saltwater, and freshwater season is here—get those licenses now. Bass fishing is open (Catch & Release only May 15 thru June 15); Brook, Rainbow and Brown Trout is ICE OUT TO ICE IN, excluding Lake Trout which is January 1 thru September 30. Salmon starts April 1 through September 30.

To purchase your Hunting license, you need your expired hunting license or a copy of your "Hunter Safety Course Certificate." Spring Turkey season is coming up in May so make sure your license is updated.

You can purchase licenses or registrations from the Strafford Tax Collector at Town Hall on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays from 8:30 am to 2 pm, and Tuesdays from 1 to 6 pm.

### NH THUNDER TRACK & FIELD PROGRAM

The NH Thunder Track & Field Program is currently taking registrations for the 2017 Track & Field season. More information and online registration is available on our website, www.nhthunder.com. Or you can print out and return the registration form with the program fee of \$50.00—which includes new uniforms this year and meet fees—made payable to NH Thunder, P.O. Box 173, Strafford, NH 03884. Early Bird Registration is by March 31; after that the fee changes to \$55.00. Registrations will also be taken the first night of practice.

The program will begin on Monday, April 17, and run through the end of May. The Track & Field Program is open to boys and girls between the ages of 7-15 years as of December 31, 2017. As always, we're slaves to the whims of nature. It always seems Spring drags its heels and then runs full force into Summer. Observing the re-birth of Spring is one of life's wonderful experiences. Giving in to the old adage "April showers bring May flowers," we can look forward to Mother Nature giving us sunshine and warm temperatures so we can get outside and begin gardening. Here are a few tips to get us started—(1) Be prepared with an organized "To Do" list and take advantage of whatever nice days we are afforded; (2) After the thaw, you can start planting the first batches of peas, swiss chard, and onion sets. These are best planted every two weeks. Ornamental grass can be seeded; (3) Start seeds indoors for peppers, artichoke, eggplant, broccoli and tomatoes; (4) Divide rhubarb as soon as it pops through the ground; (5) Clean out the asparagus bed; (6) Start basil seeds inside; (7) Weed and divide perennials. Pot extras for the Garden Club Plant Sale in May; (8) Fertilize or use compost to enrich the soil; (9) Make notes on your calendar to take pictures of your vegetable and flower gardens every few weeks as a record of what you planted and for warranted bragging rights for friends and family.



### **CONSERVATION NOTES**

We had a good turnout at our March meeting. Several important topics were discussed. We concurred with the New Hampshire Association of Conservation Commissions in their opposition to proposed bill SB136. Among other things, this bill would prohibit the Federal Government from acquiring through donation or purchase more than 2% of the State's land including the White Mountain National Forest area, and including conservation easements where the Federal Government is the primary easement holder. This legislation would create several difficulties, most notably, limiting the ability of conservation commissions to protect natural resources. The Town of Strafford has been doing a stellar job in this regard, and currently over 25% of our land is in conservation.


There was discussion of new zoning rules handed down by the State. It was emphasized that our Town Zoning Board will use



everything available to keep the Town rural. Many thanks to them. Bear-Paw reports approval of trail connecting Spencer Smith and Evans Mountain is pending with the Department of Environmental Services.

Don't forget that April 22 is Earth Day. There are many ways to enjoy the day, whether it is picking up litter from the roadsides or spending some time outdoors on trails or waterways. The Isinglass River is beautiful this time of year with a good volume of water. Some of us can recall how close it came to being turned into a reservoir in the 1980's. Sometimes the best decisions are the ones not made. If you live in Strafford, chances are you have seen wild turkeys in your yard or nearby. The Toms are strutting, and their sudden changes of head colors to vivid blues, whites and reds is striking. All the birds have a wonderful display of greenish, bronze and copper tints in their feathers. The successful re-introduction of this native species in NH is nothing short of remarkable.

### TOWN DEMOCRATS HOST HEALTH CARE FORUM

Learn more about what proposed changes in the Affordable Care Act may mean for you at the next meeting of the Strafford Town Democratic Committee, set for Tuesday, April 4, at 7:00 pm at Hill Library. The featured speaker will be Patrick Carroll, an expert on healthcare policy and the District Director for Congresswoman Carol Shea-Porter. All are welcome to this public event. The non-partisan Congressional Budget Office estimates that the proposed TrumpCare law would cause 14 million people to lose their health insurance in the first year. The cost of uncompensated care would drive up premiums. And Medicaid block grants would be capped and states could use those revenues for general operations-a big concern in a state like New Hampshire with a rapidly aging population.

In March, the committee elected a new slate of officers for a two-year term: Chairman Bob Perry; Co-Chairman Sharon Omand; Treasurer Roger Mumper; Secretary Jane Vachon; and at-large delegate to the Democratic State Convention Carol Perry. Thanks to all for serving.

### STRAFFORD TOWN REPUBLICANS

Kerry sees hope for Strafford School to bring up its ratings and lower its costs. Kerry spoke highly of one of the staff who has been very spirited and innovative. 
