The whole mile route for swimmers will be from the Northwood shore all the way around the island.

#### STRAFFORD GARDEN CLUB



The next meeting of the Strafford Garden Club will be held on Monday, August 7, 2017 at the Bow Lake Grange Hall. The regular meeting begins at 1 p.m. At 2:30 our program begins with presenter Francie Von Mertens. At a time when the decline of pollinators is increasingly in the news, the Strafford Garden Club will host a presentation titled "For the Pollinators." Von Mertens will focus on native bees and honey bees, the pollinator pros, and steps being taken in backyards and beyond to reverse their decline. She will pass along pollinator-friendly plant suggestions, spring through fall, and general landscaping concepts that benefit foraging and nesting habitat. Active in land conservation as a long-time volunteer and now honorary trustee of the Harris Center and New Hampshire Audubon, Von Mertens leads field trips with a natural history focus and writes about the natural world. The public is invited to join us for this interesting and informative presentation.

Also, you are invited to join us for our trip to Shin-boku's Japanese Gardens in Wentworth, NH on August 22. Stroll and view the largest and finest Japanese garden nursery in America. Carpooling is provided and will leave from the Grange Hall lot at 10 am that day. Lunch at the Rumney Rocks Bistro will follow the tour.

Quite a lot has been accomplished in Gwen's Garden in the last few weeks. We wrote about the first section plantings in our column last month. The second phase, which consisted of existing perennials, was cleared thinned and mulched. These two areas take up about one-third of the entire garden at the base of the Dam. The remaining area is to be limited to flowering shrubs. Some of the existing forsythia, holly, and azaleas were kept, and the area was cleared and heavily mulched. #### **CONSERVATION NOTES**

One of the multiple functions of the Commission is to hear concerns from town residents and offer support as possible. For this very reason meetings are open to the public and participation is encouraged. A good example this month focused on the topic of what are commonly known as junkyards. While Strafford does not currently have any licensed auto salvage yards, any accumulation of 2 or more unregistered vehicles on a property constitutes a junk yard. Since 1965, all municipalities in New Hampshire have had the responsibility to license junkyards at the local level. This is in accordance with RSA Chapter 236 sections 111 through 129.

Why the concerns? The primary ones are environmental. The Conservation Commission has an expressed interest in water quality and the people who drink it. Some waste products from accumulating motor vehicles which can potentially contaminate surface and ground water are gasoline, diesel fuel, oil, transmission fluid, power steering and brake fluids, gear oil, lead acid batteries, chlorofluorocarbons, and asbestos from brake shoes. Mishandling of these can negatively impact environmental quality in the form of petroleum hydrocarbons, heavy metals, acids, and suspended solids. Other concerns with the buildup of old vehicles and tires is fire hazard and the fact that they are unsightly, possibly affecting abutting property values.


The Department of Environmental Services is extremely helpful in guiding citizens and municipalities in options for taking corrective action to deal with violations. The town has the authority to act under NH RSA 236:111-129 and can help educate the people to get in compliance or it can take legal action. The town does have authority, and DES will back them up. Concerns may be brought to the attention of the Zoning Board and Selectmen. #### NOTES FROM THE TOWN CLERK

Dog Licensing—Avoid late fees; license your dog by April 30 of each calendar year in accordance with State law. If your dog is not licensed by now, you are subject to a \$25 fine for each dog in addition to cost of license and late fees.

On-Line Vehicle Renewals—You can conveniently renew your vehicles and boat registrations and license your dogs with the Strafford Town Clerk online. Just follow the instructions on the renewal letters we send or go to www.strafford.nh.gov (our Town website) and locate the red "Online Payments" button. The Strafford Town Clerk will process your online renewals and mail your registrations/licenses to you. Only renewals can be processed online; allow one week for processing; all new vehicles, new boats, vehicle transfers, and new dogs must be processed in person at the Town Clerk's office.


