GARDEN CLUB NEWS

Strafford Garden Club again enjoyed the culinary goodness of a November dinner created by Randy Brisson and the presentation of Strafford Citizen of the Year to Ellen White for her extensive community service. Mary Lou Lambert was honored, as well, as Garden Club Member of the Year for her many contributions to club efforts over a number of years.

As to the season, gardens are being put to rest for the winter at this point in time. If you have enjoyed the beauty of dahlias, now is the time that they will soon sustain a hard frost. Then a two-week rest will allow their tubers to "ripen" prior to cutting back stems at 6 to 8 inches, allowing for easier handling. Using a fork to lift tubers, one then air dries them for a few days prior to storage in a cool, dry place for winter. Many folks also lift glad bulbs for the best manner of winter storage, after several days of drying and cleaning the bulbs. Tuberous begonias, as well, can be cellar stored in their pots, to then re-grow and bloom next season. Free plants can also be waiting in your flower garden, if you think to collect seeds once pods are dry. Place in marked envelopes, and you'll have a head start on your spring flower plots by early spring indoor sowing.

Our Hill Library now carries the Garden Gate magazine, a gift subscription from the Garden Club, which offers great gardening information and zone recommendations on plantings.

The Club visited a sister club in Portsmouth recently to enjoy wisdom from their guest speaker, Paul Parent, who is a well-known local expert on plant propagation. His Sunday morning radio show is a must for any serious gardener, with tips and call-in queries.

Our December meeting is the traditional Christmas potluck on December 4 at 12 noon. Prospective members may attend as guests. Let us know you wish to join us by emailing b.nemetz@snhu.edu as soon as possible.

BEAR-PAW REGIONAL GREENWAYS

Bear-Paw reports good progress in the campaign to Save Bennett Island Forever. Although still short of their fundraising goal, they hope it will be met by the December 31, 2017, deadline. The Town of Strafford's Conservation Commission is the largest single contributor to the project and has increased its pledge of support to \$50,000. The Town sees the value of protecting this special place on Bow Lake. The Swim to Save Bennett Island event was a huge success, netting over \$12,000.

Bear-Paw's Annual Meeting will be held at the Hooksett Public Library on Saturday morning, January 27, 2018. We are eager to hear from our members who attended the Annual Meeting and Conference of the New Hampshire Association of Conservation Commission on November 4 regarding the workshops they participated in.

This fall's severe windstorms produced power outages and damage throughout towns. At times like these many of us appreciate the value of generators and wood stoves. Chainsaws are also a useful commodity. Nonetheless, we are fortunate not to have experienced the hurricanes, fires, and earthquakes that other parts of the Country and world have had to endure.

You may have noticed large flocks of migrant blackbirds this year. Common grackles were particularly prevalent. They make quite a racket as they forage in the forest during the day, flipping leaves to search for invertebrates and seeds, especially beechnuts. Other blackbirds that travel in large groups are redwinged blackbirds, brown-headed cowbirds, and starlings. We hope you enjoy a peaceful and happy holiday season.

FROM THE TAX COLLECTOR

Ice Fishing will be here before you know it. Purchase your Hunting and Fishing License and Register your OHRV at the Tax Collector's Office. To purchase your Hunting License, you need your expired Hunting License OR a copy of your "Hunter Safety Course Certificate."

"Snowmobile Club Memberships" will save you an extra fee. The Snowmobile Club MUST be affiliated with the NH Snowmobile Association. Our local Strafford Swamp Stompers Snowmobile Club is affiliated. Bring that snowmobile membership number with you. It is not mandatory to belong to a club, but it does save you money. Also, get your OHRVs, Dirt Bikes, Three or Four wheelers and Snowmobile Registration at the Tax Collector's Office. If you have not registered it in



the past two years, you will need to know all the information about it (including the VIN #).

You can purchase licenses or registrations Monday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 8:30 to 2 and Tuesday 1 to 6 or any time the Tax Collector is in the Town Hall.

On-Line Vehicle Renewals—You can renew your vehicle registrations and license your dogs with the Strafford Town Clerk online. Just follow the instructions on the renewal letters we send or go to www.strafford.nh.gov (our Town website) and locate the red "Pay Online" button. The Strafford Town Clerk will process your online renewals and mail your registrations/ licenses to you. It's easy and convenient. Please allow one week for processing, and plan accordingly for inspection needs. Only renewals can be processed online; dog licenses for 2018 can be processed online beginning January 1, 2018; and coming in 2018, online Vital Records processing. Please come to the Town Clerk's Office during business hours if you purchase a new vehicle, wish to transfer a vehicle, or if you acquire a new dog. Transfers: Remember to bring your registration with you if you would like to transfer plates to a new vehicle.


Voting machines are computers programed by a private vendor to read and accumulate data from ballots cast, which is a major departure from hand counts because the processing inside the computer is secret ... it is against state and federal law for anyone to know what's inside the machine, or how it was programed. It is regrettable that we have allowed our most fundamental right, the right to vote, to become the vehicle for a profit-making industry. A check on this secret process is to conduct an audit against the machine count. The Town of Strafford Democratic Committee has endorsed LSR 18-2327, a bill that authorizes a moderator to conduct a hand-count verification of machine-counted ballots.


