

STRAFFORD TOWN REPUBLICANS

The Strafford Town Republican Committee Roundtable will meet on the first Wednesday in March due to a scheduling conflict. We will still meet at Hill Library from 6:30 to 8:00.

While the follow up enforcement will increase for veracity of same day voting affidavits, any person will remain able to vote with no proof of residency and only swearing to this fact. What has been a limp follow up will become more robust to check for and punish cheaters in the months after the election. A bill passed the House increasing registration fees for vehicles that have higher MPG to compensate for the lower gas taxes paid. We discussed the increasing liability of the State Retirement Fund, how the then Democratic Governor and Legislature stopped the 15% agreed upon sharing that started when the State mandated all retirement funds be in their pool. The work requirement in the Medicare expansion is very

forgiving allowing things like looking for work and caring for a sick relative. HB1263 is being pushed back by the home school community due to its intrusive nature. Thirty-eight other states have an election or retention election of judges, and there may be consideration of having that in New Hampshire. Please join us on March 7, 2018, at Hill Library.

CONSERVATION NOTES

Bear-Paw's Annual Meeting was a big success. The event was held at the Hooksett Public Library. Mike Marchand, the NH Fish and Game Department's Nongame and Endangered Wildlife Program Supervisor, gave a presentation on ongoing population studies on turtles, snakes, mammals and birds. Strafford is prime habitat for many of these species, particularly the Blanding's turtle.


The Town of Strafford was well represented at the event. Shirley Brownell received an award of recognition for her service as a passionate conservationist. She participated in the Swim to Save Bennett Island this past summer and successfully completed the course. Shirley was instrumental in raising over \$12,000 along with the other 18 participants.

The Strafford Conservation Commission also received special recognition for our efforts in making the Bennett Island Easement a reality. This award will be proudly displayed in the Strafford Town Hall.

Work has been completed on trimming the undergrowth along the power lines in town. We are pleased to report that care was taken to avoid damage to sensitive wetland areas. Plenty of blueberry, winterberry and junipers were left intact. The deer enjoyed an immediate benefit from the fallen seeds and easier access to browse that was hampered by the heavy and icy crust from winter storms.

LICENSES/REGISTRATIONS AVAILABLE AT TOWN HALL

Purchase your Hunting and Fishing License and register you OHRVs and Snowmobiles at the Tax Collector's Office. To purchase your Hunting license, you need your expired Hunting license OR a copy of your "Hunter Safety Course Certificate" or "Archery Education Certificate". Register OHRVs, Dirt Bikes, Three- or Four-wheelers and Snowmobiles at the Tax Collector's Office. If you have not registered it in the past two years, you will need to know all the information about it (including the VIN #). Snowmobile club memberships will save you an extra fee. The Snowmobile club MUST be affiliated with the NH Snowmobile Association. Our local Strafford Swamp Stompers Snowmobile Club is affiliated. You will also need that snowmobile membership number. It is not mandatory to belong to a club, but it does save you money. As of July 1, 2018, you must have your membership number with you, or I won't be able to register your machines as club members. Licenses and Registrations are available to purchase any time the Tax Collector is in the building.

READY RIDES

Ready Rides is a non-profit organization formed to provide rides for seniors and physically challenged neighbors in Barrington, Durham, Lee, Madbury, Newmarket, Northwood, Nottingham, and Strafford who need transportation to medical and dental appointments. We recently added Newfields and are looking at other nearby towns to expand this service.

For our last fiscal year ending 9-30-17, Ready Rides completed 2,711 trips and drove almost 68,000 miles for those needing rides. For Strafford, that included 32 residents who used our service for a total of 309 trips. Although Strafford has 13 vetted drivers, those 309 trips were completed by many drivers from our 8 other surrounding towns. Although we don't guarantee that every request will be fulfilled, for this past year we were able to complete 98% of the Strafford trips that were requested.

The success of our program depends on our volunteer drivers. We are always looking for new drivers. Our program works around your schedule and availability; you can do as many or as few rides as you want. Drivers select rides from a list of requested trips to match a driver to a rider. We offer training programs for new drivers and mileage reimbursement. 

FROM STRAFFORD SCHOOL BOARD

There are two very important dates in March that all voters and taxpayers need to mark on their calendars. The first, Saturday, March 10, 2018, is when the School District Meeting will be held. It's at the school and will begin at 8 am. During this meeting, the School Board will be presenting the 2018-2019 budget for approval. This budget is almost ten-times the size of the town budget and has a significant impact on the town tax rate. Also during this meeting, a Warrant article proposing minor changes to the current Collective Bargaining Agreement (CBA) with the Strafford Education Association (SEA) and an addition of \$155,500.00 to the budget over a two-year period will be voted on. The language of this Warrant comes from a Fact-Finding report delivered to the Board, which the Board voted not to support 4-1. This warrant is the culmination of almost four years of trying to negotiate with the SEA. Throughout this time frame, the SEA has rejected almost every change to the CBA while demanding increased pay and current benefits. Every proposal brought forth by the Board included a pay raise for the employees, but each was turned down. The SEA feels they should have the authority to make decisions that we pay Administrators for, and they feel the town of Strafford can afford to pay more for their increased demands. I hope you will take the time to attend this important meeting and hear discussion from both sides. Over the past four years, the Board has publicly discussed the CBA issues with the voters during numerous meetings. We have yet to hear the SEA advocate for themselves in public.

The second important date is Tuesday, March 13, 2018. On this day the voters will select 3 members to the School Board. I urge everyone to talk to the candidates and get a better understanding of where they are with the CBA issues and school budget. There are two incumbents running, as well as four newcomers. Please take the time to find out as much as you can about each candidate as these positions have a significant impact on how our school is run and how the budget is formed. This is one of those elections where your vote will really matter, so please don't think that you can't make a difference.

Online Vehicle Renewals & Dog Licensing—For your convenience, you can renew your vehicle registrations and license your dogs with the Strafford Town Clerk online. Simply follow the instructions on the renewal letters we send or go to www.strafford.nh.gov (our Town website) and click on the red "Online Payments" button. The Strafford Town Clerk will process your online renewals and mail your registrations/licenses to you. It's easy and convenient. There are extra fees associated with online transactions which are explained during the online process. Only renewals can be processed online; allow one week for processing; all new vehicles, vehicle transfers, and new dogs must be processed in person at the Town Clerk's office.

2018 Election Dates—March 13: Town and School Elections at Strafford Town Hall, which is open for voting only. Polls open at 8 am and close at 7 pm. March 10: Annual School District Meeting at 8 am in the Strafford School Gym. March 17: Annual Town Meeting in the Strafford School Gym beginning at 8:30 am.

Voter Registration—Residents may register to vote with the Strafford Town Clerk during regular business hours on or before Thursday, March 1, 2018. Last day to register to vote prior to the School and Town Elections is Saturday, March 3, between 11 and 11:30 am when the Supervisors of the Checklist sit at Town Hall. New voters may also register on Election Day, March 13. Please see the Voter Registration tab on the Town
