



### **CONSERVATION NOTES**

Be on the lookout! We are about to have the Big Night! (if it hasn't happened already, which, given this winter and the snowpack remaining at Calendar deadline time, is unlikely). What is the Big Night? Several Conservation Commission members and others attended the presentation at Hill Library by Brett Amy Thelen of the Harris Center for Conservation Education in early March to learn about the one night that brings out the spotted salamanders, wood frogs, and others to make their way to vernal pools to mate and lay eggs. They will be moving in huge numbers from underground and under leaf litter often across our roads to find the pools almost always where they were born. Brett let us know that when three things are in place it is the amphibian signal—the snow needs to be mostly gone, the night temperature needs to be above 40 degrees, and it needs to be raining. When in early April we recognize that such a night is here, drive carefully! There will be places in town where they will need to cross roads to find their home vernal pool. A vernal pool is one that will dry up later in summer so that it can't support fish. If you know of one near your home, take a good flashlight out, and you may be able to see the spotted salamanders twining together in this amazing Big Night ritual.

At the March Conservation Commission meeting we discussed the idea of creating a composting area for Town residents. Russ Hunter of Bow Lake Estates had brought the

idea to the agenda and recognizes the challenges we would face in trying to do this. Such an area could be especially useful for residents who have smaller properties and not a great deal of space for leaf and grass clipping composting. Conservation Commission members invite all who are interested in this to help form an *ad hoc* committee to research the possibilities. If you would like to help investigate the ways this could be accomplished, let the Conservation Commission know by attending the April 6 meeting at Town Hall at 7:00 pm or just leave your name with Liz Evans at Town Hall, 664-2192.

### NOTES FROM THE TOWN CLERK

Please license all dogs by April 30—A reminder that all dogs 4 months and older must be licensed each year between January 1 and April 30. Avoid late fees. See below for details on licensing your dogs online!

Online Vehicle Renewals & Dog Licensing—You can renew your vehicle registrations and license your dogs with the Strafford Town Clerk online. Just follow the instructions on the renewal letters we send OR go to www.strafford. nh.gov (our Town website) and locate the red "Online Payments" button. The Strafford Town Clerk will process your online renewals and mail your registrations/licenses to you. It's easy and convenient. Only renewals can be processed online; allow one week for processing; all new vehicles, vehicle transfers, and new dogs must continue to be processed in person at the Town Clerk's office. We continue to offer renewal services by mail or in person at the Town Clerk's office.

NOTE: The State of NH now requires that the Town Clerk enter Drivers License numbers when processing titles/title applications. Please have your license available for the Town Clerk.


