



READY RIDES

Ready Rides is a non-profit organization formed to provide rides for seniors and physically challenged neighbors in Barrington, Durham, Lee, Madbury, Newmarket, Northwood, Nottingham, and Strafford who need transportation to medical appointments.

In October we completed our first full year of operation. Starting with our first ride in February, we completed 774 trips this first year. This included 105 rides for Strafford residents and 238 for Northwood residents. The last month of our fiscal year we completed a total of 117 rides.

We continue to see a rapid growth in ride requests month after month. The success of our program depends on our volunteer drivers. We are always looking for new drivers. Our program works around your schedule and availability; you can do as many or as few rides as you want. Drivers select rides from a list of requested trips to match a driver to a rider. We offer training programs for new drivers and mileage reimbursement.

Online Vehicle Renewals & Dog Licensing—You can renew your vehicle registrations and license your dogs with the Strafford Town Clerk online. Just follow the instructions on the renewal letters we send OR go to www.strafford. nh.gov (our Town website) and locate the red "Online Payments" button. The Strafford Town Clerk will process your online renewals and mail your registrations/licenses to you. It's easy and convenient. <u>Only</u> renewals can be processed online; 2015 dog renewals can be processed online beginning January 1, 2015; allow 1 week for processing; all new vehicles, vehicle transfers, and new dogs must continue to be processed in person at the Town Clerk's office. We continue to offer renewal services by mail or in person at the Town Clerk's office.

NEW: The State of NH now requires that the Town Clerk enter Drivers License numbers when processing titles/ title applications. Please have your license available for the Town Clerk.



BIG TREE

Cal Schroeder found a Strafford County champion red maple on his back property line. That's not exactly "in his own backyard" but close enough. Cal noticed that our Town had lots of sugar maples on the list and one striped maple, but no reds. So he took a measuring tape out to an old red maple growing on the stone wall between his property and his neighbor's. Sure enough, it was not only big enough to be the Town champ but turned out to be larger than the former County champ in Barrington.

The Schroeder's red maple trunk is 110 inches (9 feet 2 inches) in circumference at four and a half feet off the ground, 78 feet tall, and has an average crown spread of 35 feet.

Hope this inspires more of you to look for and appreciate big trees. Some very obvious trees that we are missing from our Town list are Common Apple (not grafted), aspen, beech, gray birch, river birch, any of the cherries and American chestnuts. That's just the start of the alphabet. You can see a complete listing of the New Hampshire Big Trees at nhbigtrees.org.

This is the season we put our gardens to bed for the winter. Our responsibilities include the Dam Garden, as well as the many little garden beds and planters we take care of around town. This year we are adding the Town Hall landscape for thinning, mulching, and general beautification, so be on the lookout for signs of this in the spring. And, of course, we always welcome helpers on our workdays, a great way to get a little exercise, make friends, and give back to your community.

Holiday activities are happening this month, as you would expect. The group will make Kissing Balls on Monday, December 1, from 10 am to 12 noon, at the Grange Hall, coordinated by Carol Thompson this year. Please bring evergreens (except hemlock) and decorations. Our Holiday party will be at Mary Lee's home, 55 Pointe Trinity, at 12 noon on December 8. It's potluck so bring your favorite dish to share. For the Yankee Swap, "as seen on TV" gifts (\$5-20 range) are encouraged.

Flower of the Month—If you want fall flowers in your garden, the *Montauk Daisy* is the way to go! It is lovely in

a rock garden, can serve as a specimen plant and makes for a good cut flower. It attracts butterflies and bees, but is rabbit and deer-resistant (yay!). For care, grow this perennial in full sun; soil can be just average in fertility, as long as it is very welldrained; trim in the spring or early summer to encourage it to be more compact. 


HISTORICAL NOTES




