



Dog Licenses—A reminder that all dogs 4 months and older must be licensed each year between January 1 and April 30. See below for details on licensing your dogs online!

Online Vehicle Renewals & Dog Licensing—You can renew your vehicle registrations and license your dogs with the Strafford Town Clerk online. Just follow the instructions on the renewal letters we send OR go to www.strafford.nh.gov (our Town website) and locate the red "Online Payments" button. The Strafford Town Clerk will process your online renewals and mail your registrations/licenses to you. It's easy and convenient! Only renewals can be processed online; 2016 Dog renewals can be processed online beginning January 1, 2016; allow one week for processing; all new vehicles, vehicle transfers, and new dogs must continue to be processed in person at the Town Clerk's office. We continue to offer renewal services by mail or in person at the Town Clerk's office.

The Town Hall will be closed for regular business on the following days in January, February & March: Monday, January 18, 2016—Martin Luther King Jr. Day; Date to be determined 2016—Presidential Primary *VOTING ONLY*; Monday, February 15, 2016—Presidents Day; Tuesday, March 8, 2016—Town Election Day *VOTING ONLY*.

Election News: This year, at Town Meeting, the voters of Strafford approved the purchase of an electronic tabulator to be used in Strafford Elections. As per RSA 656:42, the clerk will give "public notice of the date and time of a pre-election test of the electronic ballot counting device and test ballots." Come help Bear-Paw Regional Greenways celebrate 20 years of conservation successes at its annual meeting on Saturday morning, January 30, 2016, at the Hooksett Library beginning at 9 a.m. Strafford landowners and Bear-Paw members have been a big part of Bear-Paw from the beginning. The acres conserved in our Town, both private and public lands, are more than a quarter of the 8000 acres Bear-Paw has helped protect across the 11 towns where Bear-Paw works. And no other town has supported a conservation project so enthusiastically with hard work and fun as Strafford did with our flamingo project to help protect Evans Mountain! That spirit continued with the individual contributions to help protect the Brown islands and shoreline this year.

Raptor rehabilitator, Jane Kelly, from Epping will be the featured speaker at the annual meeting and will bring some of her live clients with her. As usual, there will be ample treats to go with coffee in the morning, hearty hot dishes for lunch, interesting donated items for the raffle, and a hike for those interested in the afternoon. in January, and if you are not on the Bear-Paw mailing list, find information about the event on the website, www.bear-paw.org.

With so many newly conserved public properties, Bear-Paw has begun a series of walks to discover the trails and hiking possibilities on all of them. Several Strafford folks have already trekked to some of them for exploratory ventures. There will be about two of these hikes a month, alternating between Wednesday and Saturday mornings. The next one is scheduled for Saturday, January 2, 2016, and will be to explore the Dearborn Estate conservation easement owned by the Town of Raymond. It has a variety of landscapes from lake to ledges and a rail trail suitable for biking. We will carpool from the Grange at 9:00 am. The next hike will be on Wednesday, January 20, with the location to be announced. IMPORTANT: Due to a scheduling issue, the School District Hearing previously scheduled for January 27, 2016 <u>has been changed</u> to Wednesday, February 3, 2016, at 6 pm. It will be held at Strafford School. This is one of the most important meetings the Town holds each year. It is when the School budget, which is approximately 10 times the Town budget, is gone over line-by-line, and every question you have is answered. Please make this a priority to attend.

Also, the School Board continues to try to work out a new contract with the Strafford Education Association (SEA). Due to the Board declaring impasse in December, the negotiation notes were made public at the December 9, 2015 School Board meeting. Also during that meeting, the Board Chairman's response to the SEA's posting on Facebook was recorded. If you would like to review any of this information to see what the Board is struggling with, it is included in the meeting minutes posted on the School website or as a hard copy at the SAU or School office.


FRIENDS OF HILL LIBRARY





HILL LIBRARY LAUNCHES NEW COMPUTER LAB

91% of Americans (16 or older) say that public libraries are important to their communities. They are no longer just places for books; libraries of all types are viewed as anchors in their communities. Makerspaces are trending and provide evidence that libraries are continuing to evolve beyond the traditional focus on just print collections. Instead, libraries are offering free technology workshops, small business centers and 24/7 virtual access to e-Books and digital materials. Along with this, digital literacy continues to grow as an important library service.

Libraries are not just about what we have for people, but what we do for and with people. HILL LIBRARY HOSTS JOHN PORTER "The History of Agriculture as Told by Barns"

On Thursday, January 14, at 7:00 pm at Hill Library, please join John Porter as he takes us on a chronological walk through time, with photo illustrations of barns around the

State that are examples of various eras of agricultural history. John Porter was raised on a dairy farm in Lebanon, NH. He graduated from UNH with a BS in Animal Science; then went on to get a Master's from Cornell University in Animal Nutrition and Farm Management; and



later got another Master's Degree from Bob Jones University in Education Administration. He served as a Dairy Specialist for the UNH Cooperative Extension from 1974 until his retirement in 2006. He still works part-time for UNH and operates his own consulting company, Farm Planning Services, LLC. "The History of Agriculture as Told by Barns" will show the evolution of barn architecture and tell the story of New Hampshire agriculture. Barns changed from the early English style, to Yankee style, to gambrel and then pole barns to accommodate the changing agriculture over time. There are a number of different examples of barn architecture in Strafford. Come hear some great stories about barns and bring your stories to share as well.
