



NOTES FROM THE TOWN CLERK

The Town Hall will be closed Tuesday, March 10, 2015 – Town Election Day (open for Town Election only).

Online Vehicle Renewals & Dog Licensing—You can renew your vehicle registrations and license your dogs with the Strafford Town Clerk online. Just follow the instructions on the renewal letters we send OR go to www.strafford. nh.gov (our Town website) and locate the red "Online Payments" button. The Strafford Town Clerk will process your online renewals and mail your registrations/licenses to you. It's easy and convenient. Only renewals can be processed online; allow one week for processing; all new vehicles, vehicle transfers, and new dogs must continue to be processed in person at the Town Clerk's office. We continue to offer renewal services by mail or in person at the Town Clerk's office.

NOTE: The State of NH now requires that the Town Clerk enter Drivers License numbers when processing titles/ title applications. Please have your license available for the Town Clerk.

TOWN ELECTION will be held at the Strafford Town Hall Tuesday, March 10, 2015. The polls will be open for voting from 8:00 am to 7:00 pm.

TOWN MEETING will be held at the Strafford School Gymnasium Saturday, March 14, 2015_beginning at 8:30 am.

SCHOOL BOARD NOTES

Contract negotiation update: The Strafford School Board declared a negotiation impasse due to being unable to reach an agreement with the Strafford Education Association (SEA). Both parties agreed to meet with a mediator to help with the process. Due to a severe snow storm the date of the meeting, the mediator and representatives were unable to hold the meeting. Because the parties could not get together again prior to the date needed to stay within the legal timelines, there will not be a new SEA contract warrant to be voted on at the District Meeting. The teachers and paraprofessionals will continue to work under the current contract. Both parties have agreed to continue negotiations after Town Meeting. If there is an agreement reached, the contract would have to be ratified by the SEA and voted on by the School Board. If it passes, the School Board will have to petition the NH State Superior Court to get approval to hold a special Town Meeting to have the contract voted on by the Town. This will be discussed at School District meeting on March 11, 2015.

The School Board would like to pass on their congratulations to the 2015 Strafford School Spelling Bee Champion Kelsey Pine (8th grade) and the Runner-up Elizabeth Abbott (6th grade). The Board would also like to congratulate the 2015 Strafford School Geography Champion Brooke Sawyer (8th grade) and the Runner-up

SPOTLIGHT ON THE SELECTMAN'S RACE

There is one contested race in the Town election on Tuesday, March 10. Two candidates have stepped up to run for the three-year position replacing longtime Selectman Stephen Leighton, who is retiring after many years of dedicated service. The following two candidates are in the running.

Bryant Scott of Parker Mountain Road has been a lifelong resident of Strafford. He served on the Strafford Police Department from 2007 to 2014 and currently is a Strafford County Deputy Sheriff. Scott also has managed residential and commercial construction projects for the US Army Corps of Engineers. "Due to my involvement in local and county law enforcement, I have an integral knowledge of the town," said Scott. "I've had the opportunity to guard the well-being of Strafford residents for several years now, and I'd like to continue to do so as a Selectman of the Town." As Selectman, Scott would emphasize continuing to work with the Planning Board for future plans of the Town, collaborating with neighboring towns and town officials to create a vision for the future of our Town, and prioritizing Town needs to control spending and keep property taxes down. "I care deeply about preserving Strafford's small town integrity as we push forward with future improvements," said Scott.

Stephanie M. Gray of Spruce Pond Road is running for Selectman because she is committed to community involvement. Gray previously held the post of Selectman in Strafford from 2008 to 2011. During her tenure, she expanded the use of technology, creating the Town's website and promoting the availability of online services. She encouraged Strafford's participation in regional efforts to work with other towns to share expenses for services and equipment. Gray feels it is very important to take care of the needs of Strafford's poorest residents. "I would like to see more outreach to the elderly and young people in the community," she said. After serving as Selectman, Gray moved away from Strafford for two years while earning her Master's Degree. She now has returned to Strafford and works full-time as a Physician's Assistant in Maine. Previously an EMT (Emergency Management Technician) for the Strafford Fire Department for five years, Gray is supportive of Town Police and Fire Departments. She feels her experience, both as a Selectman and an EMT, gives her the background to effectively set priorities for the community. "It's important to see what the people of Strafford need and to strategize about how best to meet those needs in a cost-effective way," said Gray.

CONSERVATION NOTES

We know we are having a winter to remember when even the hardy group of Wednesday hikers organized by Conservation Commission member Carolyn Page, haven't been able to get in a good trek for weeks. Many others who enjoy a good snowshoe walk have laboriously created a trail in the deep snow only to see it filled by new storms and swirling drifts of powdery snow. These are tough times for those of us who like to get out and enjoy our beautiful Strafford countryside.

Thanks to our friends the Strafford Swamp Stompers, however, we may have some options. They keep a well-plowed parking area down at the bottom of Mile Hill by their trail on Johnsonboro Road. Once some of the snow machines have had a chance to take the trail, it makes a great place for a hike along the edge of the Strafford School District's conservation property and in to the Hill Pond.

Over at the Isinglass River Conservation Reserve (IRCR), Don Clifford keeps the parking area plowed. It isn't too long a trek on snowshoes past the kiosk and down the Cowpath Trail where one can again connect with the snowmobile trail system. Don also plows a parking area at the Strafford Town Forest near the sign. There is no handy snowmobile trail to access there, but a tough group of several on snowshoes could take turns trail breaking.

The Conservation Commission tried to hold its February meeting twice and twice had to cancel because of blizzard

conditions. The next meeting is scheduled for March 2 at 7:00 pm at Town Hall; as always, the public is welcome.

BIG NIGHT

In early Spring, people who are passionate about frogs and salamanders watch the skies and the temperatures. When the moment is right, they grab their headlamps and head out into a dark rainy night to view the circle of life in full swing. As the earth begins to thaw and Spring rains drench New Hampshire, salamanders, frogs, and toads begin to stir underground in their places of hibernation. They are waiting for small depressions in the northern forest floor to fill with meltwater, forming vernal pools and the season's first warm rain event. Then it is their time; this is their BIG NIGHT!

This is when the woods come to life with salamanders, frogs, and toads (referred to as "charismatic megafauna") making their annual migration from winter habitat to breeding habitat. They are headed for vernal pools, and not just any

vernal pool, but to their birth places where they will find a mate and lay their eggs. This grand event is over in a matter of days, and the salamanders and frogs make their way back into the woods, leaving masses of eggs in the vernal pools. By Summer's end, many of these vernal pools will have dried out, revealing little trace of the remarkable and exceedingly important circle of life they contained in April.

Join Brett Amy Thelen, Science Director for the Harris Center for Conservation Education, on Wednesday, March 4, at 7:00 pm at Hill Library for an introductory talk and slide presentation about the exquisite, ephemeral world of the vernal pool and this massive migration of amphibians. Brett will provide a brief overview of common vernal pool species and discuss the ecological importance of these small, seasonal ecosystems to New England forests.




