





CONSERVATION NOTES

The Strafford Conservation Commission has a busy fall this year. We are trying to keep up with our new conservation lands and the Town Forest. Right now our efforts are focused on the Town Forest. The lower portion that you can see from Parker Mountain Road (Route 126) near the Town Forest Marker is in danger of being over taken by Norway Maple. That maple, as you may know, is considered invasive. It may look pretty, but it is very prolific and tends to take over an area to the detriment of all the other native species. The dark red maples that people loved to plant on their lawns are Norway maples. We just find it hard to tell how fast they are spreading because their offspring revert to saplings with green leaves.

A group of Commissioners met one Sunday to pull all of the saplings at the Town Forest, but soon gave up figuring that our arms and backs would give out before we made very much progress with clearing the patch. We need to come up with a better plan. The problem is that the mother tree (the one that is spreading all the seeds) is not on Town Forest land.


Norway Maple is not the only invasive in this section of the forest. Burning bush is present and has been the subject of a "pull" led by our Town Forester, Charlie Moreno. Burning bush can be readily seen at this time of year because of its pinkishred leaves that everyone loves. But, as with the Norway Maple, it spreads with vigor blocking out our natural plants. Birds eat the berries and deposit the seeds far and wide. This would normally be a good thing, but the berries are not as nutritious for our birds as the berries of local plants. It is like eating at a fried food joint vs. the health food store.

Other projects at the Town Forest are fun ones. Since the new forest access road was put in, we have needed a connecting link to the lower section of the Neil Mooers Trail. This trail starts at the lower field mentioned above and can connect to a link taking hikers to the top of the Mountain or continue to a parking lot half way up Route 126. Commissioners will meet to cut and mark this new section.

Continuing the work of Eagle Scout Matt Dustin, the Commissioners and any interested folks can join the biennial walk up the Spencer Smith Trail to clean the leaves out of the water bars. Water bars are those little ditches or logs put across a trail to take flowing rain water off to the side to prevent it from eroding the Trail. As many of you know, the Spencer Smith Trail was badly eroded when Matt stepped in to help rectify the situation. Now that the trail is in better condition, we need to keep it that way. This Trail gets a lot of use. Most any day that you pass by, there are cars in the parking area. So we know that there are a lot of hikers out there; and if any of you are interested in helping with this (or other trail projects), please let one of the Commissioners know.


STRAFFORD SWAMP STOMPERS SNOWMOBILE CLUB

STRAFFORD SCHOOL BOARD

The Strafford School Board has begun contract negotiations with the Strafford Educators Association. The current contract runs through this year. Holding open negotiations was discussed at our opening meeting but was not agreed upon by both parties. Therefore, negotiations will be held in confidential meetings, and only information released by both parties will be publicly available. Once an agreement is achieved, the contract will go before the Town for approval. Anyone interested in reviewing the current contract and health benefits may download the files from the School website under the School Board section.

Also, a new budget year is just beginning. The Board will begin the line-by-line budget process starting with our first November meeting. We strive to complete this in December to get ready for the Town Budget Hearing in January/ February.

Online Vehicle Renewals & Dog Licensing—You can renew your vehicle registrations and license your dogs with the Strafford Town Clerk online. Just follow the instructions on the renewal letters we send OR go to www.strafford. nh.gov (our Town website) and locate the red "online payments" button on the home page. The Strafford Town Clerk will process your online renewals and mail your registrations/licenses to you. It's easy and convenient. ONLY renewals can be processed online; 2015 dog renewals can be processed online beginning January 1, 2015; allow one week for processing; all new vehicles, vehicle transfers, and new dogs must continue to be processed in person at the Town Clerk's office; we continue to offer renewal services by mail or in person at the Town Clerk's office.
