

#### NOTES FROM THE TOWN CLERK

ON-LINE VEHICLE RENEWALS & DOG

LICENSING—You can renew your vehicle registrations and license your dogs with the Strafford Town Clerk on-line. Just follow the instructions on the renewal letters we send OR go to www.strafford.nh.gov (our Town website) and locate the red "on-line payments" button on the home page. The Strafford Town Clerk will process your on-line renewals and mail your registrations/licenses to you. It's easy and convenient! ONLY renewals can be processed on-line; allow one week for processing; all new vehicles, vehicle transfers, and new dogs must continue to be processed in person at the Town Clerk's office. We continue to offer renewal services by mail or in person at the Town Clerk's office.

NEW: The State of NH now requires that the Town Clerk enter Drivers License numbers when processing titles/ title applications. Please have your license available for the Town Clerk.

THE TOWN HALL WILL BE CLOSED on the following days in October & November: Monday, October 13, 2014 – Columbus Day; Tuesday, November 4, 2014 – General Election Day; and Thursday, November 27, 2014 - Thanksgiving Day.

THE (STATE) GENERAL ELECTION will be held at the Strafford Town Hall on Tuesday, November 4, 2014. The polls will be open for voting from 8 am to 7 pm.

VOTER REGISTRATION FOR STATE GENERAL

ELECTION and SUPERVISORS OF THE CHECKLIST SESSIONS—You may register to vote with the Town Clerk during regular business hours on or before Thursday, October 23, 2014. You may also register to vote at the Supervisors of the Checklist session to be held on Saturday, October 25, 2014, 11 to 11:30 am at the Strafford Town Hall. If you have not registered to vote by October 25 and wish to vote at the State General Election, you may register at the polling place on Election Day, November 4.

#### SUPERVISORS OF THE CHECKLIST IN STRAFFORD

Supervisors of the Strafford Checklist will be sitting at Town Hall on Saturday, October 25, 2014, between 11 and 11:30 am for additions and corrections of checklist per RSA 654:27, 28. No additions or corrections shall be made to the checklist after this session until election day, except as provided in RSA 659:12, RSA 654:8 II. If you are registering as a new voter, proof of citizenship, age, and residency in Strafford needs to be provided.

#### RUSSIAN ICONOGRAPHY: 1,000 YEARS OF TRADITION

On Saturday, October 4, at 9:30 am, The Bow Lake Baptist Church will present an Interactive Presentation with Marina Forbes entitled *Russian Iconography: 1,000 Years of Tradition.* The presentation will take place at 9:30 am after a Pot Luck Breakfast which will start at 9 am.

Traditional Russian icon painting has been a living and evolving art form for more than 1,000 years. This illustrated presentation by Marina Forbes deals with the spiritual and secular significance of Russian religious art from the 10<sup>th</sup> Century to present day. Icon-making involves the painting of stylized religious images on wood using traditional natural materials and techniques which are determined by longstanding conventions. Using a slide show and numerous exhibits, including examples of her own work, Forbes examines the history of icon painting in Russia and the unique nature of the icon as a sacred object and a product of an artistic tradition. Participants may bring personal icons for examination and comments.

Presenter Marina Forbes is a lecturer, historian and award-winning artist who has written extensively on Russian traditional arts, history and the rich tapestry of Russian culture. She is licensed with the Hermitage Museum in St. Petersburg and is featured on the NH Council on the Arts Rosters for Arts in Education and Traditional Arts. Each year, Marina leads cultural tours to Russia where she regularly

updates her scholarship, gathering photos and documents, visiting craft factories, GULAG sites and monasteries, and interviewing journalists, political figures and scholars on the current state of affairs in Russia. Marina has a distinctive ability to generate energy and enthusiasm in the audience and to bring the rich fabric of traditional Russian art and folklore to life for children of all ages through memorable and thought-provoking programs.

This program is free and open to the public, and it was made possible through a grant from the New Hampshire Humanities Council www.nhhc.org. The Program will start at 9:30 am. Her 1914 diary is filled with details about weather and farm life in the horse drawn era prior to rural availability of tar roads and electricity. Many Crown Point residents are mentioned. I am looking for more Strafford stories and pictures to write about.

#### **BIG TREE**

Late last spring you couldn't help but notice the Horse Chestnuts in full bloom. One in particular caught my eye. It was right in my neighbor's yard. How could I have ignored it all these years? In checking the Big Tree register, I realized Strafford didn't have a champion Horse Chestnut. A call to our Strafford Big Tree coordinators, Dolly & Dennis Theriault, got the tree measured. In the process we had a good chat with our new neighbors, Ginny and Jim Keddy. They are the new owners of the old JoAlCo horse farm and are thrilled to have a champion tree in their yard.

The tree actually turned out to be two trunks growing together, so only the larger trunk was measured. It has a



circumference of 99 inches (so you can imagine how big it looked with the two trunks). The tree is 42 feet tall and has an average crown spread of 54 feet. We got to use the Big Tree Program's brand new laser range finder to measure the height, but backed up the figure with the trusty clinometer to be sure. This is the first Horse Chestnut to be measured in Strafford. You may know of one that is larger. Just put a measuring tape around it at about four and a half feet. If it is larger, call Carolyn Page at 664-2934 or email at carolynenzpage@gmail.com. We'd love to have some more big tree activity in Strafford.
