



RUSSIAN ICONOGRAPHY: 1,000 YEARS OF TRADITION

On Saturday, October 4, at 9:30 am, The Bow Lake Baptist Church will present an Interactive Presentation with Marina Forbes entitled *Russian Iconography: 1,000 Years of Tradition.* The presentation will take place at 9:30 am after a Pot Luck Breakfast which will start at 9 am.

Traditional Russian icon painting has been a living and evolving art form for more than 1,000 years. This illustrated presentation by Marina Forbes deals with the spiritual and secular significance of Russian religious art from the 10th Century to present day. Icon-making involves the painting of stylized religious images on wood using traditional natural materials and techniques which are determined by longstanding conventions. Using a slide show and numerous exhibits, including examples of her own work, Forbes examines the history of icon painting in Russia and the unique nature of the icon as a sacred object and a product of an artistic tradition. Participants may bring personal icons for examination and comments.

Presenter Marina Forbes is a lecturer, historian and award-winning artist who has written extensively on

Russian traditional arts, history and the rich tapestry of Russian culture. She is licensed with the Hermitage Museum in St. Petersburg and is featured on the NH Council on the Arts Rosters for Arts in Education and Traditional Arts. Each year, Marina leads cultural tours to Russia where she regularly updates her scholarship, gathering photos and documents, visiting craft factories, GULAG sites and monasteries, and interviewing journalists, political figures and scholars on the current state of affairs in Russia. Marina has a distinctive ability to generate energy and enthusiasm in the audience and to bring the rich fabric of traditional Russian art and folklore to life for children of all ages through memorable and thought-provoking programs.

This program is free and open to the public, and it was made possible through a grant from the New Hampshire Humanities Council www.nhhc.org. The Program will start at 9:30 am. MUSEUM REIMBURSEMENT PROGRAM

The Strafford Library Association (Hill Library's "friends group") offers a \$500.00 per calendar year fund for reimbursement on admission fees to any museum in New England. A family can request up to \$25.00 per visit per year (amount not to exceed the actual admission fees). All you need to do following a visit to a museum is fill out a reimbursement request form (which will include the patron's library card number) and submit it at the circulation desk in the Library, together with the receipt from your visit which shows the full cost, number of attendees, and the date. Requests made after the \$500 fund is depleted will not be processed. The required form will be available at Hill Library or can be downloaded from the Library's website—www. straflib.org. CONSERVATION NOTES

Bear-Paw is again offering one of its most popular family friendly field trips, the footprint casting workshop on the Suncook River in Epsom on Saturday, September 13, from 2 to 4:30 pm. Bear-Paw Board member Lisa Clark, who has collected footprints from many places around the world, will bring kits with materials necessary for making footprint casts to keep for each participant. On two previous versions of the workshop, Lisa has found an excellent section of the Suncook shoreline where numbers of animals have come to the river and left tracks in the riverside sediments. Kids and adults will enjoy learning the techniques and almost certainly take home a well-cast souvenir or two from the excursion. Preregistration is a must so Lisa can assemble kits for everyone; for directions to the site; and so that Bear-Paw can send out notification if the weather causes a change in plans. It seems as though each month it is necessary to write about an invasive species that is making things difficult for our native plants. In May volunteers worked at the Isinglass River Conservation Reserve pulling garlic mustard, which sends chemicals through the soil inhibiting the growth of native understory. Last month we sent out a call for help in pulling the hundreds of foot-high Norway maple seedlings in the Town Forest, which in one area carpet the forest floor and out-compete our native maples. As summer wanes we can see that Strafford is beginning to have stands of purple

loosestrife. Why is such a pretty plant such a bad thing? You can read much about it on the Internet and will see that again, like other invasives, it out-competes and displaces native vegetation. Each plant in that little clump along the roadside can produce more than 2 million seeds a year, and before long displace the varied native plants in our wetlands that our own wildlife depend upon. A loosestrife monoculture habitat is of little use to our own critters. If you have a clump of it on your property, you can slow dispersal by breaking off the flower stalks into a black plastic bag before the seeds form, sealing the bag and then letting it rot in the sun before taking it to the dump. If you decide to dig up the plant, try to get all the roots because it can sprout from even a bit left and then do the same black bag routine. If it comes back, just continue to take off and dispose of the flower heads before they seed!


